Founded in 1978 to meet the complex needs of individuals with multiple disabilities and severe mental retardation, DEC's Center Point Training Center provides developmentally disabled adults with a variety of experiences in skill building and daily living.



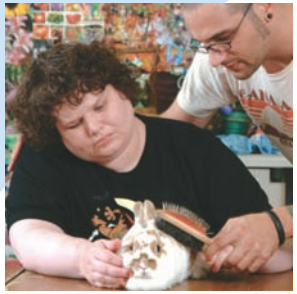
CPTC's dedicated staff enhances the quality of life of the people they serve through the development of sensory/perceptual motor skills, to stimulate each individual's

senses and provide an important link to his or her environment; living skills, such as housekeeping activities, shopping, good grooming, cooking and other activities that promote self-reliance and integration in the surrounding community; basic academics, and pre-vocational skills.

Among the other supportive programs offered at Center Point are occupational therapy, behavior management, socialization and communication, sports and other physical activities, massage therapy and music therapy. Individuals are given an opportunity to look beyond themselves and develop nurturing skills by helping to care for a variety of small pets, as well as tending to indoor plants and outdoor gardens.



Individuals at DEC's Center Point Training Center are encouraged to exercise good citizenship by "giving back" to their community. Under the guidance and leadership of the CPTC Aktion Club, a public service organization sponsored by the Kiwanis Club of



Lansdale, developmentally disabled adults help deliver meals for the Meals On Wheels program in Lansdale; cook for the MANNA On Main Street program; as well as participate in numerous other fundraising activities designed to meet a host of community needs.

Licensed by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania as an Adult Training Facility (ATF) and by the Department of Aging as an Older Adult Daily Living Center (OADLC), Center Point also provides specialized care and services at a pace geared towards disabled adults over the age of 59 plus those individuals with a diagnosis of early dementia or Alzheimer's.



With the support and participation of a dynamic parents group, Center Point provides a dignified and positive environment in which developmentally disabled adults reap the benefits of truly meaningful and functional activities.
